Public Hearing on Proposed 2016-17 Budget

Alameda students Elle Tindall and Abby Schlosser spoke on the importance of sustainability.

Angel Yah-Palacios, Ivonn Flores-Herrera, Michel Gonzalez Ramirez, Alma Mora, Laura Peraza, Victor, and Carmen Rubio advocated for a continued partnership with the Latino Network and the Early Escalera and Juntos Aprendemos programs that they currently provide to PPS and wish to expand.

Lana Co, Huynh Tran, Stephen Le, Phong Nguyen, Grace Groom, Mike Tran, James Luu, Crista Heron, Denise Quigley, and Sarah Tran spoke in support of the Vietnamese Immersion Program and asked that positions not be cut from that program.
