Budget Headline

- \$17 Million Shortfall Governor's Budget
- \$13 Million Investments
- Superintendent's priorities
 - Equitable staffing model, curriculum development, professional development, multi-tiered systems of support, social emotional supports, special education services, human resources/ talent development, strategic partnerships, health and safety investments
- Responding to Board, community leaders, & staff
- Minimal layoffs
 (district working with individuals to offer other positions if interested)

Board's Role*

- Receive Superintendent's budget message and proposed budget
- Receive community comment and questions on budget
- Modify budget as needed
- Impose taxes, make appropriations, adopt budget
