1. Synopsis of Contractor's Work:

Hampton Tutors will continue their strategic partnership with Hand2Mouth Theater this year, with a culturally specific and multi-racial organization, to implement proven strategies that support BIPOC students. Continuing a partnership this year with community organization Hand2Mouth to provide robust and comprehensive in-person programming for PPS students throughout the summer of 2022 to complement Accelerated Learning. They will provide culturally responsive programming that is engaging, safe, and promotes positive peer to peer interactions that reinforce students' cultural identities.

Hampton Tutors is offering an engaging summer program that combines academic and arts enrichment to support lifelong learning, inquiry, and social-emotional well-being. This program was so popular last summer that they have expanded to a full 5 days per week for the entire contract period. PPS students deserve a summer of safe and fun in-person activities and we are proud of the community-based partnerships we have formed to provide that environment. This programming includes STREAM units, SEL development, theater provided by current SUN partner Hand2Mouth, Art and Music for K-8 students, and employment and mentorship for youth ages 14-25.

Hampton Tutors offers a capacity of 528 and 12 youth employees in 2 sessions - Number of students per session: K-2nd: 88, 3rd-5th: 88, 6th-8th grade: 88.
