Updated Correction Action Plan for PE	I would like to know what kind of materials and training are being given to K-5 teachers to implement the 15 minutes/ day PE requirement during their circle time.	To be answered.
General question about contracts	Under new contracts I see lots of "Request for Proposals" under Description of Services. The contract amounts sometimes say, "Not to exceed different amounts." What does this mean? Are we just getting bids from different companies? Is the amount the maximum that we will spend? Are the contracts not yet negotiated?	<p>On the contracts expenditure resolution, you will see a "not to exceed \$xxx" in the contract amount column when the contract is not for a fixed cost or commitment but instead represents a maximum total dollar amount that could be spent under the contract. For example, on the 10/10 agenda, there are several flexible services contractor pool (FSCP) contracts for three-year time periods and an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000. FSCP contracts are procured by Request for Proposals, in which the proposers' experience, qualifications, and hourly labor fees are evaluated. The intention of the FSCP process is to award multiple contracts, resulting in a pool of contractors to which we can quickly award small work scopes (generally under \$100,000) via work order as needs arise. The amount of the work and total cost of that work over the three-year time period is not known in advance.</p> <p>We also use "not to exceed" in other types of contracts where the contract represents potential spend, but no certain commitment of dollars, such as multi-year contracts for as needed maintenance services or classroom/office supplies.</p>
