Ethics and Conflicts of Interest Training and Compliance

- Members of the Board of Education are public officials under ORS 244.020(15) and, as such, are required to disclose actual and potential conflicts of interest. Under Oregon Revised Statute 244.020(3), a board member has an actual or potential conflict of interest when participating in an official action which would or could, respectively, result in a financial benefit or avoidance of detriment to the public official, a relative of the public official, or a business with which either is associated.
- Public officials, including school board members and PPS employees need to follow the Oregon Ethics law, ORS 244, and observe the Oregon Government Ethics Commission's "Oregon Government Ethics Law - A Guide for Public Officials." [https://www.oregon.gov/ogec/Pages/Guide-for-Public-Officials.aspx]
- 3. Prior to voting or taking action on an issue before the Board of Education, Board members must disclose any actual or potential conflicts of interest.
- 4. Board members will annually engage in training related to Oregon Government Ethics, Public Meetings laws, and Public Records laws.
- 5. Annually Board members will sign an ethics and conflict statement attesting to participating in annual District-provided training relating to ORS chapter 244 and pledging to adhere to the Oregon statutory requirements and District policy on these topics.
